Staff visited 31 locations and presented information and held advisory conversations with several business operators in these areas. I have attached a map and spreadsheet with the contact information of the locations visited.



Dear Property Owner/Manager:

It has come to the attention of this office that Greenville Police Officers and Probation and Parole arrested Lamone Harrison and Troy Bullock at the above location and charged them with possession with intent to sell or deliver Schedule II controlled substances, possession of controlled substances within 1000 feet of school, maintaining a dwelling for the purpose of drug activity, and possession of firearms by felons. On May 31, 2012, you were advised of drug nuisance activity at your property located at 1201 Myrtle. On May 9, 2011, you were notified of drug nuisance activity at this same address. On March 29, 2011, you were notified of drug activity involving 1203 Myrtle. On May 12, 2011, a meeting was held in this office to discuss drug nuisance activity problems involving your property. I also would note that on April 16, 2012, drug nuisance notification was sent concerning your property at 209 Pennsylvania and on May 31, 2012, drug nuisance notification was sent concerning your property at 1110 Myrtle Ave.

As noted in previous correspondence, drug activity is a nuisance affecting the health, safety and welfare of the persons in this community as defined by NCGS §19-6.1 As stated below, there are steps that need to be taken to address these problems as well as complying with my follow up letter dated May 13, 2011 after our meeting.

You should immediately make efforts to stop the nuisance from occurring or recurring. There are tools you can utilize to ensure this same type of activity does not occur again. Those tools are as follows:

- 1. Summarily evict tenants involved in drug-related activity.
- 2. Cooperate with law enforcement officials to prevent the activity from reoccurring or assist in the apprehension of the individuals engaged in the activities.
- 3. Insert lease restrictions on your rental property prohibiting the illegal possession or sale of narcotic drugs.
- 4. Conduct criminal records checks of all of your prospective tenants.
- 5. Utilize reference checks of the prior residencies of your prospective tenants.
- 6. Improve security, work with the Greenville Police Department concerning trespassing and access to the property when vacant.

Your failure to utilize the above methods to help alleviate the drug activity on your property or the failure to take other reasonable steps to ensure this type of incident does not happen again may cause the forfeiture of your property.

It is apparent from the previous notifications that you have failed and continued to fail to address drug nuisance activity on your property. As a result of frequency of the drug activity in properties owned by you, I am forwarding this correspondence to the City Manager's office requesting action be initiated under Chapter 19. We strenuously request your assistance and cooperation in addressing the concerns regarding nuisance activity on your properties; however, the City of Greenville must consider the safety and welfare of those in the community.







# SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

### Taser Deployments: 1

July 8, 2012 -2nd degree trespass / resist, delay or obstruct

### **Significant Events**

- On June 30, Greenville police arrived at the Phoenix night club when four people had been shot
  and/or injured as patrons exited the building. One victim died as a result. Five suspects have
  been arrested in connection with the murder of Dontae Haddock.
- On Sunday July 15, Greenville Police Responded to the report of an armed robbery that
  occurred in the parking lot of the OASIS convenience store, at the intersection of E. Tenth
  Street & Greenville Blvd.

Police officers stopped the suspects at the Portertown Road intersection. 2 suspects were detained while the 3<sup>rd</sup> suspect fled on foot. A .22 caliber revolver was recovered at that time. Additional officers responded to search for the 3<sup>rd</sup> suspect.

Within a few minutes, the owner of the Oldsmobile, Mindy Jackson, called the police department to report her car had been stolen from her home at 3900 Elkin Ridge, Apt. B. Elkin Ridge is less than 1 mile from the intersection of Portertown Road and E. 10<sup>th</sup> Street, where the 3 suspects were detained.

Police then responded to Elkin Ridge where they found the 3<sup>rd</sup> suspect and the owner of the car.

On July 21, 2012, officers from the Greenville Police Department Warrant Squad arrested
Tawan Elam and Derrick Jenkins on unrelated outstanding warrants. A Property Crimes Detective responded to the arrests in reference to questioning these suspects on several other cases.

Further investigation found evidence that Elam and Jenkins were responsible for four (4) motor vehicle break-ins that occurred around the South Memorial Drive/Greenville Blvd. corridor.

# CONSIDERATION OF AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED 2012 – 2013 REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION BUDGET

Mr. Rees: After meeting with the Finance Department, there is interest that has been made on the general obligation (GO) funds and minor obligations that were not needed for attorney fees. The adjusted budget is as follows: West Greenville: \$213,000 GO Bond and \$50,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for an original total of \$263,000. The proposed adjusted budget for West Greenville is \$309,994. Center City: \$1,449,782 GO Bond for an original total of \$1,449,782. The proposed adjusted budget is \$1,747,949. Staff recommends that the Redevelopment Commission adopt the 2012 – 2013 adjusted budget and forward to the Greenville City Council for consideration.

Motion was made by Mr. Evan Lewis and seconded by Ms. Judy Siguaw to approve the 2012 – 2013 adjusted budget and forward to the Greenville City Council for consideration. Motion carried unanimously.

# CONSIDERATION OF BUDGET INCREASE FOR MERCHANT'S ALLEY PROJECT

Mr. Rees: Initial Merchant's Alley project budget was \$152,286.75. The additional utility repair work and lighting budget is \$6,720.60 The new water line for 4<sup>th</sup> Street Pocket Park is \$2,525.00. The new proposed budget will be \$161,532.35.

Ms. Williams: Is this the second increase?

Mr. Rees: No, the contingency funds were used for removal of the oil tanks.

Mr. Mansfield: Was there ground contamination?

Mr. Rees: There was minimal to no water contamination.

Mr. Mills: Are there any other findings that may show up?

Mr. Rees: No, we have dug up everything.

Ms. Williams: What is the date for completion?

Mr. Rees: There are 10 - 14 days of work remaining.

Mr. Mansfield: What action is needed?

Mr. Rees: Staff recommends that the Redevelopment Commission approve a contract amendment in the amount of \$6,720.60 with Lanier Construction as well as a payment to Greenville Utilities Commission of \$2,525 for completion of the Merchant's Alley project.

Motion was made by Mr. Chris Mansfield and seconded by Mr. Don Mills to approve the additional expenditures. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Mansfield: What is the lighting plan?

Mr. Rees: Light fixtures will be put on the walls of the existing buildings. LED lights and lighting will meet standards in public parking lots.

Ms. Williams: How will alley be regulated for usage?

Mr. Rees: Commerce on the sidewalks needs to be orderly and needs to go through the permitting process.

Ms. Williams: Space needs to be shared.

# **UPDATE ON WEST FIFTH STREETSCAPE PHASE II PROJECT**

Mr. Jones: The major challenge is the intersection. The traffic analysis was done. A roundabout would be beneficial. A roundabout is safer with fewer conflict points, lower speeds, easier decision making and pedestrian friendly. The aesthetics of a roundabout is less visual clutter, enhancements can be integrated with design, and project gateway treatments are possible.

Mr. Mansfield: Will this accommodate a bike lane?

Mr. Jones: I do not know. It is pedestrian friendly.

Mr. Mansfield: The paved buffer inner circle should be inside enough for bicycles.

Ms. Williams: What is the property on the corner?

Mr. Jones: The property is a car wash.

Mr. Mansfield: What does the City own?

Mr. Jones: The northwest corner and southwest corner is owned by the City. The Intergenerational Center is on the northeast corner.

Mr. Mansfield: All properties should be willing to make it work.

Mr. Jones: The roundabout keeps traffic flowing. The bike lanes will be brought back to the table. I would like to have another public input session prior to the August Redevelopment Commission meeting.

# **UPDATE ON UPTOWN PLANTER PROJECT**

Mr. Rees: Areas of Fifth Street look old and less attractive. The City is proposing to plant 8 – 10 trees and scatter planters throughout the street.

Mr. Mills: I am concerned about the theft and vandalism.

Mr. Rees: Some trees have been sawed off at the ground. The trees on Cotanche and Reade are in good shape. The planters should be seasonal.

Mr. Mansfield: Video cameras catch vandalism.

Ms. Siguaw: Put signs up that there are cameras in place monitoring.

Mr. Mills: Is Releaf being involved?

Mr. Rees: I think so.

Mr. Mills: Green, purple and gold would be nice colors.

Ms. Williams: Do not mess with vegetation or you will be prosecuted.

Mr. Woodson: Why this location?

Mr. Rees: The Center City and the Redevelopment Commission have invested dollars there.

Ms. Williams: Appearance standards may be needed.

Mr. Mansfield: There should be trash cans integrated as well.

Mr. Rees: Staff requests that the Redevelopment Commission authorize staff to proceed with the Uptown Planter project with a budget not to exceed \$25,000. Staff will provide a detailed report on project execution to the Redevelopment Commission at the August meeting.

Motion was made by Mr. Evan Lewis and seconded by Mr. Chris Mansfield to approve the Uptown Planter project with a budget not to exceed \$25,000. Motion carried unanimously.
