Community Outreach Update

December was a busy month for Recreation Staff as they planned and hosted several community events and programs at various facilities. A few pictures are provided highlighting some of these events.

On December 4th the Specialized Recreation Staff hosted their annual **Holiday Dance** at the Drew Steele Center. This event, much like other dances hosted by Specialized Recreation staff, drew over 400 individuals with disabilities who were able to dance, enjoy good food and socialize with friends.

On December 14th, South Greenville Recreation Center (SGRC) held the annual *Give Back* event to kick off the holiday season. Staff worked with various community groups to collect over 200 gifts for children ages 5-12. These gifts included bicycles, helmets, board games and various gift cards. This well-attended event was co-sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., *Pathways to Life* and Recreation & Parks.

SGRC staff then, on December 17th, held a **ladies pajama party** which included food, gifts and games. Over 30 young ladies participated in the event. This was the second year for the party and staff look forward to making it an annual tradition.

SGRC and Eppes Recreation Center (ERC) have teamed up to implement their *Winter Youth Basketball League*, to be played at both sites. The league includes over 150 youth ages 5-12. The 13-18 year old age groups will participate in a league at the Drew Steele Center. Both leagues begin play mid-January.

In February, Recreation Staff will update Council regarding additional services being held throughout the community. At SGRC and ERC, several community events and programs will take place including the *Get Fit, Get Strong* fitness program for teens, and the *I Need a Job Workshop* (focusing on job preparedness skills). Details regarding various new teen programs beginning this spring at the Drew Steele Center will also be provided.




