

General Location Map











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




Highway Sign Overlay

This c. 1899 commercial building is a two-story, four-bay brick structure. The original storefront has been removed and the corner entrance reconfigured to the central bay of the replacement storefront. A flat-roofed awning shelters the storefront. The second story retains arched window openings, which were previously infilled with brick. Above the window openings are a corbelled brick course, topped by honeycomb brick panels and surmounted by a metal dentil cornice. Sanborn maps show a corner-entrance commercial building on this site since 1900. The site is listed in City Directories as the site of the Frank Wilson Men's Clothing from 1916-1951.

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Design Guidelines

Chapter 1

Title Introduction

Pages 3-12

- In order to preserve the community's historic heritage, the Commission has the power to recommend to the Greenville City Council the designation of any building, structure, site, or object as a historic property or an area as historic district
- A property or district recommended for designation shall be of special significance in terms of its history, prehistory, architecture, and/or cultural importance and possess integrity of design, setting, materials, feeling, and association.
- Any property or district recommended for designation must lie within the planning and zoning jurisdiction of the City of Greenville.
- The responsibility of the Greenville Historic Preservation Commission is to protect the architectural integrity of the historic district and landmarks.
- To meet that responsibility, the commission reviews applications from property owners and residents for Certificates of Appropriateness to make certain types of changes within the historic district and properties
- Applications are reviewed to determine if the proposed changes are consistent with the Design Guidelines.



- April 2019 HPC Selection Committee identified the property as a potential landmark
- November 2019 HPC recognized the Frank Wilson Store to be of special significance in terms of its historical, prehistorical, architectural and cultural importance and possesses integrity of design, setting, workmanship, materials, feeling and or association
- December 2019 Survey and research report submitted to SHPO
- January 2020 Staff received SHPO comments
- February 2020 HPC recommended approval 5:1



- The research report was submitted to the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) on December 16, 2019
- SHPO made the following comments:
 - ➤ The building illustrated an up-to-date style favored by many commercial retailers in Greenville and throughout eastern North Carolina
 - The building's 1st floor entrance elevation was altered by owner Frank Wilson c. 1917
 - Subsequent changes completely altered the original design of the building
 - ➤ The 2019 alteration has substantially changed both the original and subsequently altered character of the building by introducing a new store front and roof top terrace that obscure the historic nature of the building's design.
 - The modern, "streamline" appearance is counter to the surviving original elements of the upper façade
 - ➤ Due to these alterations and the highly visible roof top terrace features, the building no longer illustrates the work of Hill C. Linthicum



The Historic Preservation Commission voted (5:1) to recommend approve the request at its February 25, 2020 meeting.



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Greenville Population Trend






