Subject:	Town Creek Culvert-Meeting with Businesses Adjacent to the Project Corridor

The City of Greenville City Council awarded a contract to Trader Construction for the reconstruction of the Town Creek Culvert. The existing culvert is over 90 years old and in poor condition. The contract for replacement of the culvert is for approximately \$24.5 million. The Notice to Proceed for the project was issued in February of 2018 with the contractor beginning construction activities in March 2018. Construction of the culvert began within Town Common Park and work has proceeded towards East 5th Street.

Some major milestones for the project include:

- Installation of a constructed wetland and the headwall installation of the culvert located on East 1st Street. The constructed wetland is the first of six (6) Stormwater Control Measures (SCM).
- Excavation and placement of the 10'x8' reinforced concrete box culvert (RCBC) under 3rd
 Street which is approximately 19 feet deep.
- Removal of the existing arch culvert between 3rd Street and 4th Street making the new RCBC live and operational.
- The second SCM, a small Regenerative Stormwater Conveyance (RSC), was installed just north of 3rd Street.
- Completion of a reforestation effort by City and ECU staff and volunteers. Trees were planted between 1st Street and 3rd Street.
- A second crew began construction between the Federal Bankruptcy Court House and Tastee Thai just south of Reade Circle. This work will continue south under 8th Street, paralleling Washington Street and terminating at the intersection of Washington Street and 9th Street.

The City updates the public regularly through the use of social media and e-mail but as the contractor approaches 5th Street, it is increasingly important to meet with the local businesses to discuss road closures and applicable detours.

The City will be contacting local businesses to invite them to a public meeting. During the meeting, we will provide an overview of the project as well as the work schedule. We will provide detail on the work from 5th Street along Reade Circle to Evans Street. We will discuss project phasing and associated schedules. The City will explain the required detours and relocated loading zones that will be part of the future phases of the project. City and project contacts as well as future communications will also be discussed.

The meeting is scheduled for the following time and date:

Thursday January 31, 2019 3 PM - 5 PM Location – Sheppard Memorial Library

During the meeting, the City will provide the opportunity for businesses to request/schedule an additional one-on-one meeting to talk more specifically about their situation. A representative from the City as well as our contactor, Trader Construction, would attend these one-on-one meetings.
