Subject: 2018 Crime Statistics

The City of Greenville experienced a **20% drop in overall Part 1 Crime** across the city in 2018. (Part 1 crimes include those listed below as reported to the FBI's Uniformed Crime Report annually.)

While the numbers never truly tell the entire story, this past year certainly shows the results of the tremendous work GPD officers, detectives and staff are doing to directly impact the quality of life for those who live and work in Greenville.

In comparing 2017-2018, some of the most noteworthy impacts on crime were seen in the categories of Robbery -27%, Aggravated Assault -21%, Total Violent Crime -21% and Burglary -34%.


As Chief, I'm proud of the commitment and level of dedication that our men and women in uniform make every day to prevent crime in partnership with our community.

Subject: Transportation Services to Council On Aging

The Council on Aging has requested transportation services to the Alice F. Keene Center, which is located on County Home Road. Public Works surveyed various routing opportunities to evaluate how this request could be accomplished. After identifying the alternatives, a bus was placed into service to run these options to obtain information on service times. A service option has been identified and will require a modification to GREAT routes one (1) and four (4).

Public Works will notify the public of the transportation services to the Alice F. Keene Center and the route adjustments through print media, social media, the Next Bus tracking system and the City of Greenville website. Service change and routing update notices will be placed on the GREAT buses and in the lobby of the G. K. Butterfield Transportation Center. Additionally, a press event will be held at the G. K. Butterfield Transportation Center.

The following timeline outlines the scheduled public notification methods, which Public Works will use to announce route adjustments and transportation services to the Alice F. Keene Center:

- January 16, 2019 - Route adjustments were considered. A final draft of the updated transit route maps was designed and presented by Jordan Anders, Communications Technician and John Johnson, Transit Coordinator.
- January 23, 2019 - Council on Aging met with City personnel to discuss transportation services and a press event outlining proposed service to the Alice F. Keene Center.
- January 28, 2019 - Post upcoming transportation service adjustments on the GREAT buses, City social media/website and the G. K. Butterfield Transportation Center Lobby.
- February 4, 2019 - Advertise transportation service adjustments on the Next Bus tracking system and in local print and visual media outlets.
- February 4, 2019 - Hold a press event at the G. K. Butterfield Transportation Center, outlining transportation service to the Alice F. Keene Center.
- February 18, 2019 - Begin transportation service to the Alice F. Keene Center.

Public Works does not anticipate any delays in service along our current bus routes, as a result of providing transportation services to County Home Road.
