#### VI. DIRECTOR'S MONTHLY REPORT

- A. Veteran's Day Program at Town Common on Monday an annual event hosted by the Pitt County Veteran's Council in cooperation with our department with Patricia Earnhart-Tyndall and parks staff providing support for event.
- B. Hosting Greenville Gives on the first Friday of December, 12/6 at Five Points Plaza, beginning at 5:30PM. This event has become a tradition in the City and serves as the kickoff to the Holiday Season.

- C. The City and the Greenville Jaycees are hosting the first New Year's Eve Celebration at the Town Common on 12/31 beginning at 9:00PM. Proceeds from this event will be donated to the Third Street Education Center and the funding will be used to develop and implement new and improved curriculum at the Third Street Academy.
- D. Lakeland acquisitions continue on both sides of Hwy 264. Moving forward with land acquisition on the east side. Waiting to hear from state regarding a waiver for PARTF funding. In January hope to visit with potential partnerships for recreation pursuits. Director has submitted an article regarding this project for publication in the 2020 edition of Glimpse Magazine, an annual publication of the local Chamber of Commerce.
- E. Discussions continue regarding the need to replace the Community Pool at Guy Smith Park, a facility that is approaching 50 years old. Last spring the original dive tank was lost due to shifting and crumbling. Fortunately, the failure of the dive tank did not impact the main pool, despite its proximity to it, and the incident occurred early enough to remove the tank prior to the normal opening of the pool last June. The damage made it clear the current pool's days are numbered and staff needs to get serious about its replacement.
- F. Mark Nottingham will join GRPD staff on Monday, 11/25. The Commission will meet Mr. Nottingham at the January meeting.

    - iii. A new event New Year's Celebration on 12/31 at the Town Common beginning at 9:00PM (fireworks and novelties of bringing in the New Year with an emerald drop).

    - a. Parks Planner Position Update Hired Mark Nottingham from Pitt County Planning Department. Will make a great team member, bringing the skills and will teach him how to have fun!
    - b. FIP Project Update
      - i. Guy Smith Stadium Shared before and after pictures.
      - ii. Evans Park Lights LED lights, shared pictures. Project completed within 2 weeks. Can program lights for energy savings. Project cost for two fields was \$460,000. Future FIP plans will include transition to LED lights for all ball fields.

      - i. Steel poles are being added (shared photos).
      - ii. Mike Watson and John Berry have this project on schedule.
