Public Hearings – Rezoning Requests

5. Consideration of an ordinance (requested by Harrell and Kristey Pascasio) to rezone a 0.36 acre tract located along the western right-of-way of Ficklen Street, north of Ninth Street, and 170± feet south of Dickinson Avenue, from CDF (Downtown Commercial Fringe) to CD (Downtown Commercial). The Planning and Zoning Commission at its December 21, 2004, meeting voted to **approve** the request.
