Re:	River Park North Primitive Trail Extension

On July 27th, Sawyers Land Developing, Inc. began construction of the River Park North Primitive Trail Extension. Construction of the trail, managed by *Parks Planner* Mark Nottingham, was completed in late August and is now ready for the public to enjoy.

This project extended the existing trail 1.3 miles east along the northern bank of the Tar River. The result is a 2.5 mile primitive trail that runs from the Walter Stasavich Science and Nature Center to the eastern most point of River Park North. The following is a map of the trail:



The majority of the trail provides great views of the Tar River, with several locations allowing users to stand near the water's edge. Sections of the trail traverse unique wetlands that really enhance our

nature based recreational offerings. The end of the trail is a must see as it provides excellent long distance views down the river.
