3. Neighborhood Updates by board members

Greenfield Terrace - Carolyn Glast

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the Coronavirus hit
- Neighbors communicate with each other through chance meetings while walking in the neighborhood
- Roslyn Williams, resident and food truck owner, has been parking her truck in the neighborhood. This has been a “plus” for the numerous senior citizens residing in Greenfield

Terrace

- The Entrance Sign on Memorial Drive was damaged by a drunk, uninsured driver
- Funds to repair the sign are needed
- Two new families have moved into the neighborhood

Cambridge - Joyce Williams

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the Coronavirus hit
- Spring Cookout and Christmas party have been cancelled
- Neighborhood Association continues to reach out and support their elderly residents
- A Teen Pizza Party will be held on October 16, 2020, at Joyce Williams' carport. Teens from Single Tree and Concord were also invited.
- Joyce Williams is moving to the Raleigh/Durham area and has resigned from the NAB
- The neighborhood held a drive-by farewell on September 27, 2020, to honor Joyce's tireless work for The Cambridge neighborhood
- Greenville Police Department also honored Joyce for her work in developing a Public Safety Brochure for neighborhoods
- Belinda Nolen, a Cambridge Block Captain, has been appointed by the neighborhood association to be their liaison to the NAB

College Court - Ann Hamze

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the coronavirus hit
- The annual summer picnic and National Night Out events were cancelled
- National Good Neighbor Day was promoted
- Communication is being maintained through the neighborhood's Nextdoor.com app
- Reaching out to senior neighbors continues

Tar River/University - Ann Maxwell

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the coronavirus hit
- Zoom neighborhood meetings began in June 2020. Their Police Liaison and Code Enforcement officers have attended these Zoom meetings
- Greenville Police Dept. and ECU Police Dept. have worked very effectively together to deal with large student parties to prevent the spread of the coronavirus
- A Neighborhood Watch Captain has been appointed

Oakhurst - Susan Vickery-Mercer

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the coronavirus hit
- Annual Summer/Fall Picnic cancelled
- Neighborhood Association recommends that Halloween candy be placed outside

Lakewood Pines - Alise Rowan

- An outdoor neighborhood association meeting is scheduled for October 20, 2020. It will be catered by Great Harvest Bread. An important issue to be discussed is the re-writing of the 1940s neighborhood covenant
- The neighborhood will have their Christmas decorations up by November 1st this year
- An offer was made to Jonathan Bowling, sculptor, to place pieces of his art work on the Lakewood Pines Entrance Signs on Evans Street
- Goals: Create a neighborhood Facebook page, update Neighborhood Directory, apply for Neighborhood Improve Grant to offset any costs of placing art work on Entrance Signs

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the coronavirus hit
- A new police liaison has been assigned to The Oaks
- Several new families with young children have moved into the neighborhood
- Neighbors communicating through chance meetings while walking in neighborhood and through their Facebook page
- Annual Halloween House Decorating and Trick or Treating will be held
- Brenda Diggs, NAB liaison, will be resigning due to health issues
- Cieria Eid has been appointed by The Oaks N/A as their new liaison

Carolina East - Sharon Stang

- No in-person neighborhood association meetings since the coronavirus hit
- Communication within neighborhood association through emails, phone calls, and chance meetings while walking in the neighborhood
- The neighborhood Facebook page and the Nextdoor.com continues to be used by neighbors
- Recent issues: unlocked car break-ins, dumpster deposited on the entrance of Belvedere
- CENA members actively supported neighborhoods surrounding John Paul II Catholic High School's athletic fields in the neighborhoods' efforts to reach a compromise in regard to noise and light pollution from the proposed 3rd party use of the school's athletic field.
