Subject: 2021 National Night Out

On **August 3, 2021**, the Greenville Police Department (GPD) will continue with the nationwide National Night Out (NNO) partnership. Last year, NNO was relegated to being virtual. This year, GPD has been able to confirm ten (10) locations that will be participating in partnering with our law enforcement community. Below is a brief summary of the locations and planned activities.

- **Uptown Greenville (Five Points) 5:00p – 8:00p**
 - Food Trucks, giant yard games, a DJ, and vendors will be on site
 - GPD participation to include Center City Unit, Traffic Safety, and Recruiting

- **Third Street Center (600 W. 3rd Street) 6:00p – 8:00p**
 - Invitations have been sent to the neighboring residential area (West Greenville)
 - On site there will be food, family entertainment, and vendors
 - GPD participation will include the Gang Unit

- **Cherry Oaks North (Mary Beth Drive) 5:30p – 8:00p**
 - This is an established HOA/social event for this neighborhood
 - They will have food and door prizes
 - GPD participation will include Traffic Safety, Detectives, and a K9 handler team

- **Lakewood Pines (201 Pineview Drive) 6:00p – 8:00p**
 - A food truck is planned to be on-site
 - GPD participation will include Detectives and K9 officers

- **Crystal Springs Apartments (575 Lake Road) 6:00p – 7:45p**
 - This senior citizen community is planning a block party format with food available for residents
 - GPD participation will be Neighborhood Police officers

- **Greenville Housing Authority is hosting four (4) events 6:00p – 7:45p**
 - **Kearney Park** (601 S. Skinner St)
 - **Moyewood Center** (1720 W. 3rd St.)
 - **Dubber Laney Woods** (2815 Best Rd.)
 - **East Meadowbrook** (400 Mumford Rd.)
 - Block party format with food, music, school supplies and community resource booths
 - GPD participation will include Housing Authority officers, Neighborhood officers, and School Resource officers

- **Cypress Glenn (100 Hickory St.) 6:30p – 7:30p**
 - Lemonade and Cookies social
 - Limited to residents and GPD officers
