Date: November 2, 2021
Subject: Solid Waste Study for City of Greenville's Uptown and Rates

To better serve commercial establishments within the Uptown area, the Public Works Department is contracting with a consultant that specializes in solid waste practices. The consultant will work with City staff and local businesses to improve the collection of commercial solid waste in the uptown area. The study is needed to identify solid waste collection practices that are designed to benefit and foster continued growth and investment in the Uptown District while improving the appearance of the dumpster areas, equity of fees and rate of collection.

During the past year, numerous complaints have been received concerning privately owned dumpsters located in the City owned Hodges, Merchant and Roses parking lots. The complaints were related to the dumpster's unsightly appearance, overflowing trash, service schedule, odor, pest, and un-authorized users.

The solid waste evaluation will focus on two main aspects. The first phase is to specifically address options associated with the collection of Uptown commercial solid waste. The City's Code will need to mirror and support all changes made to the City's solid waste services. The Public Works Department anticipates the start phase one in November 2021.

The second part of the study will begin in early 2022. It will involve reviewing the current fee structure of the Public Works Sanitation Enterprise Fund. The study will also provide rate information that maintains a sustainable, customer service oriented and cost efficient solid waste service for the residents of the City of Greenville for the next five years.

The Public Works' Sanitation Division currently provides solid waste services for garbage, recycling, yard waste, bulky item collection, mosquito control, special services, curbside cart and dumpster services.

SUMMARY MINUTES FOR THE POLICE COMMUNITY RELATIONS COMMITTEE

October 12th, 2021

Sgt. Staffelbach called the Police Community Relations Committee meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., at the Greenville Police Department. Since the meeting was held virtually, Sgt. Staffelbach was the only attendee present. All other attendees were participating virtually.

INTRODUCTION OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Sgt. Staffelbach welcomed everyone to the meeting. Donald Phillips called roll call, even though only 3 members were in attendance. Present were: Kevon Gainer, Robert Cherry, and Carol Ann Bass.

Camillia Smith, City Clerk's office staff member stated that there should be information coming soon on new members.

Sgt. Staffelbach started a discussion with Donald Phillips about whether to continue with the meeting because there wasn't a quorum. There also was discussion about if Officer Whaley should go ahead with his presentation, or move it to another meeting date. The committee agreed to let Officer Whaley go ahead with a short presentation.

Officer Whaley briefly discussed the recruitment process with the Police Department. He then briefly discussed the B.L.E.T. program (Basic Law Enforcement Training) that is coordinated with Pitt Community College.

Donald asked Officer Whaley to further explain what B.L.E.T. stands for and give specific details. Officer Whaley explained that B.L.E.T. stands for Basic Law Enforcement Training. He stated that it's a State standardize program to train cadets to become law enforcement officers. He explained that the program is four months long; approximately 700 hours of training; and anywhere from 24 to 48 courses. He encouraged everyone to share the website, joingpdnc.com with anyone that is interested in learning more about becoming an officer.

Carol Ann thanked Officer Whaley for sharing the presentation and asked if there were any more questions. Robert Cherry thanked Officer Whaley for the presentation. He asked if the Greenville Police Department has a relationship with East Carolina University, specifically the Department of Criminal Justice, as far as offering internship opportunities to some of the graduating students. Officer Whaley stated yes, that we receive a lot of internship inquiries from East Carolina University. He stated that we also receive some interns from West Virginia concerning the forensics unit. Officer Whaley stated that we expose them to various areas in the department, while also seeing what area they are interested in most.

Sgt. Staffelbach stated that he wanted to add that ECU and Pitt Community College were working together in the internship program. He stated that the interns from ECU would attend the BLET program during their internship, which would give them a step ahead in their training. Officer Whaley stated that they are still working together in this aspect.

Chief Holtzman thanked Officer Whaley and Sgt. Staffelbach for all their hard work they do for the recruitment program. Chief Holtzman shared virtually with everyone the recruiting website for the department. He discussed how on the website it shows all the different units of the department would show new officers the various opportunities available. He also discussed how the website has streamlined the application and background process. Chief Holtzman stated that speed and marketing are very important tools in this competitive process.

Donald asked when a candidate who is not B.L.E.T. certified, who pays for this candidate to become certified. Officer Whaley discussed the process of the Greenville Police Department paying the candidates to attend the B.L.E.T. academy for certification. Chief Holtzman stated that other departments have asked how does department do this, because this is a great opportunity.

Donald asked Officer Whaley if the department is recruiting veterans. Officer Whaley stated that before covid-19 the police department was allowed on military bases for recruitment. He stated that unfortunately we have had the opportunity to do that since covid started. He stated that however a military representative contacted him just recently to explain a program that they just started. Officer Whaley stated he was told that the program was started to help soldiers make contact with potential employers once they leave the military.

Robert Cherry asked how competitive is the salary in our department compared to other departments similar in size across the state. Officer Whaley stated in comparison with other agencies in Pitt County, our department's starting salary is just over \$40,000, Pitt County Sheriff's Department and the Winterville Police Department salaries start at approximately \$43,000, and ECU Police Department salaries will soon be approximately \$44,000. Officer

Whaley stated that he and Chief Holtzman have discussed this; and he stated that he actually had a meeting today with the Human Resources Director concerning this.

Robert Cherry thanked Officer Whaley. He stated that he just had a suggestion for recruitment. He stated that maybe the recruiting process needs to start earlier in age levels. He stated for example, maybe have a junior academy at the middle school level to attract persons at an earlier age. He stated to have an introduction into this career field. Carol Ann stated that she absolutely agrees.

Chief Holtzman stated that we have tried a summer camp here and there. He stated that in his previous department there was a program for juniors and seniors where they learned about police, fire, and ems through a public safety program. He stated that he would like to have a conversation with Dr. Lenker about something similar in the Pitt County school system.

Sgt. Staffelbach asked everyone to please send out a pdf copy of the website that Chief Holtzman discussed to the community.

Carol Ann asked if anyone had any more questions or comments. Donald stated that no formal adjournment was needed since this was not an official meeting. Donald thanked everyone for attending and for the presentation.

Subject: Public Works Start of 2021 Leaf Season

Public Works is preparing for the start of the loose leaf collection season which is scheduled to commence in November and continue until March 2022. The Public Works Department will collect leaf piles that have been properly placed behind the curb or sidewalk of single family residences. During this time of year, Public Works will utilize five (5) vacuum leaf collector trucks as well as our customary contingent of seven (7) knuckle boom trucks.

During periods of heavy leaf accumulation and frequent residential raking, the collection schedule may be adversely impacted. During the peak of the leaf season, the weekly collection schedule may be impacted. There have been periods where the leaf volume has limited staff to bi-weekly collection. This typically occurs during November and/or December.

In order to expedite the loose leaf collection during November and December, Public Works may collect leaves six (6) days per week and utilize 10-hour work days.

Residents are asked not to mix limbs and other debris with leaf piles as this slows the collection process. Debris has to be manually removed from piles before the leaves are collected by the leaf vacuum trucks.

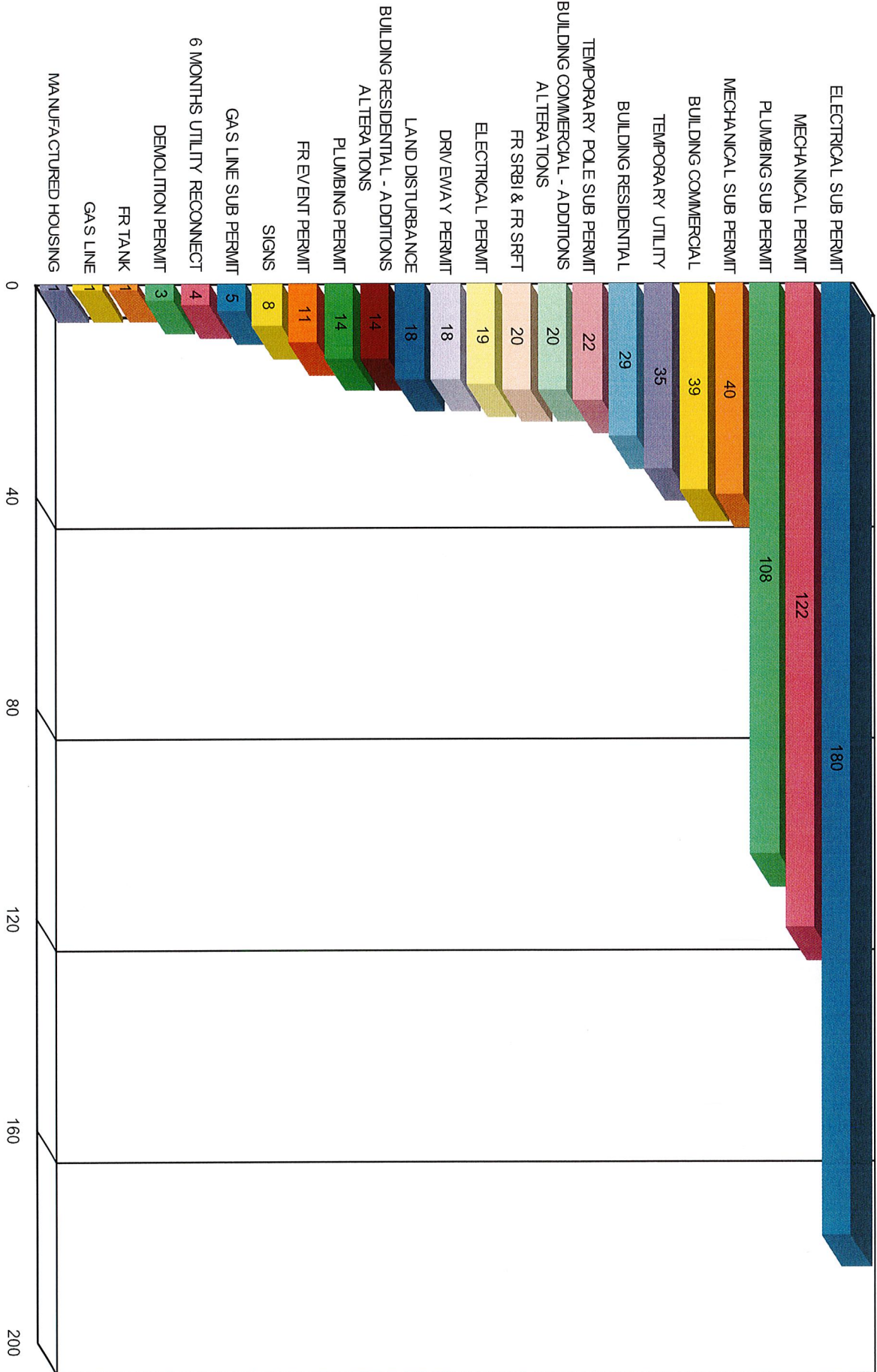
