V. REGULAR AGENDA

A. 2020 Traffic Count Data

Kerry Morrow with NCDOT presented information on traffic count data from calendar year 2020. She spoke about pandemic impacts, as well as collection maps, travel trend and data analysis impacts. Counts were collected at about 5,000 stations on non-interstate routes; about 3,000 of these were counted twice, and all interstate routes had sample counts collected along each corridor. Year 2020 was a year of highly irregular traffic patterns. Counts from the year represent a reasonable characterization of North Carolina travel but may not be appropriate for long-range data projections.

B. Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and Prioritization Process Mrs. Hampton gave a presentation on the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and Prioritization Process. She presented updates, overall goals, and delivery projects. She discussed three main decision points for developing 2024-2033 STIP.

Decision Point One: Overall Method

Consensus recommendations to date: Traditional STIP Development Method

Decision Point Two: Scenario Method for Selecting Delivery Projects

- Delivery Project set determined using Scenario-2 approach
- Anything let in FY 2026 or before, has grants awarded, or ROW underway

Decision Point Three: Committed Project Evaluation Method

C. Self-Certification of Greenville Urban Area MPO Transportation Planning Process for Fiscal Year 2023, Resolution No. 2022-03-GUAMPO

Mr. De Jesus presented information to self-certify the Greenville Urban Area MPO's transportation planning process for the upcoming fiscal year in coordination with the MPO's adoption of the 2023 Unified Planning Work Program. The TCC recommends the TAC adopt the Resolution 2022-03-GUAMPO, self-certifying its planning practices and processes are compliant with all applicable Federal and State regulations. A motion was made by Mr. Rhodes to recommend the adoption be made with the TAC. The motion was seconded by Ms. Hamilton and passed unanimously.

D. Approval of the Greenville Urban Area MPO's Fiscal Year 2023 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), Resolution No. 2022-04-GUAMPO

<u>Purpose:</u> Amna Cameron is the N.C. Department of Transportation's deputy director of strategic initiatives and program support. Ms. Cameron will provide a presentation about the Mileage-Based User Fee (MBUF) pilot.

<u>Discussion:</u> NCDOT has partnered with the Eastern Transportation Coalition to hold its 4th Mileage-Based User Fee (MBUF) pilot from June 6th to October 31th. The Coalition, a partnership of 17 states and Washington D.C., is studying a mileage-based fee to determine if an MBUF would be a more equitable and sustainable approach than the gas tax.

This pilot is designed only for elected officials and the general public.

Enrollment is open only in June and July. The pilot ends on October 31.

The Coalition and NCDOT requested participation to enroll and provide crucial feedback to shape the future of transportation funding in North Carolina. The pilot is free and designed with strict privacy protection measures to safeguard your data.

The federal grant authorizes 450 general public and elected officials to participate using a plug-in device, in-vehicle telematics, or through manual reporting.

This transportation system is funded mainly from a pay-at-the-pump fuel tax. As vehicles go farther on less fuel and some stop using any fuel at all, it will be difficult to maintain a viable transportation system in North Carolina without developing a new sustainable approach.

The Pilot

The Eastern Transportation Coalition, a partnership of 17 states and Washington D.C., needs your help to explore an alternative approach, called a Mileage-Based User Fee (MBUF). A Mileage-Based User Fee means each driver pays for the miles they drive instead of the fuel they buy. The Coalition is partnering with North Carolina to conduct a Pilot Program to determine if an MBUF would be a more equitable and sustainable approach.

Why Join?

The Coalition needs representatives from your organization to enroll and provide crucial feedback to shape the future of transportation funding in North Carolina. The Pilot is free and designed with strict privacy protection measures to safeguard your data. Participation involves four easy steps:

- 1. Enroll Fill out the enrollment form by clicking the link on the website.
- Insert Plug a small device into your vehicle to record mileage.
- 3. Drive Then drive as you normally do.
- 4. Return After a few months, mail back the device.

*These steps may vary depending on the mileage-reporting option selected.

Program (STIP) and Prioritization Process update

<u>Purpose:</u> NCDOT has tasked MPOs/RPOs to present overview of the Draft STIP to their TCC and Boards. Moreover, to discuss the swapping candidates and possible methods for swapping projects in and out (if desired). For your review we have attached the MPO's draft STIP and Swapping candidates.

<u>Discussion:</u> The draft 2024-2033 STIP was release on April 25. NCDOT developed the draft STIP based upon recommendations from the Prioritization Work Group Projects.

NCDOT's SPOT/STIP Units held a STIP Education Webinar intended for local elected officials on Tuesday, May 17. The policy education webinar focused on how Workgroup collaboration was utilized to develop a path forward, process in developing the 2024-2033 STIP without using P6.0 scoring results, and next steps including project swapping.

Summary of Removed and Delayed Projects in the new Draft 2024-33 STIP (4/25/2022):

This document provides a snapshot summary of the projects that have funding or schedule impacts as a result of the recently-released preliminary 2024-33 Draft Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The projects are broken into three categories:

- 1. The projects that have had ALL their funding removed. These projects are still listed in the draft STIP document, but are listed as "NOT FUNDED." This includes some projects that were previously "uncommitted" projects as well as some that were previously considered "committed." These projects will need to recompete for funding in P7.0 in order to regain funding projects in this category that were previously "committed" are no longer committed.
- 2. The projects that remain "committed" (now termed "delivery projects") but may have had changes to their schedule. These projects are listed in the draft STIP document as "SCHEDULED FOR DELIVERY." Four of these projects had been accelerated and three had no change to their current schedule since the reprogramming.

Pitt County CTP committee The is working finalizing recommendations and has began working on the report. In the next steps we will present draft maps and discuss public involvement dates and locations, so be on the look out for public meetings. Draft 10-Year Transportation Plan Up for Review

There will be upcoming opportunities for the public to comment on the draft in person and online.

The draft STIP document is presented as a spreadsheet rather than the PDF from years past. The spreadsheet is more user friendly, allowing people to sort columns to explore projects that interest them. The STIP is typically updated every two years, however, the draft plan was developed under unique circumstances.

Material and labor cost escalations led local, regional and state transportation planning partners to recommend and the Board of Transportation to concur with foregoing the usual process for prioritizing projects. Instead, they decided the new STIP should be built from existing projects in the current (2020-29) STIP to the extent that funding allows, while giving planning organizations the opportunity to propose project swaps that meet the needs of their communities.

The draft plan still adheres to the Strategic Transportation Investments law since the projects are derived from the 2020-29 STIP, which was developed using the required data-driven process and input from local officials and the public. NCDOT plans to use public input and planning organization requests to produce a revised draft of the STIP by December. Transportation officials are expected to adopt the 2024-33 STIP in summer 2023.

About the League's Community Spark Grant Program

Overview

With generous support from both the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity and General Motors (GM), the League of American Bicyclists is delighted to announce its Community Spark Grants to support local advocates and organizations working to improve their communities through bicycling. These grants will award up to \$1,500 to each organization to build local capacity for projects and programs that reach people across the wide range of a community's demographics and help create communities where bicycling is a safer, easier, and a more accessible option for people of varying ages, abilities, and disabilities. These efforts are part of the CDC's Active People, Healthy NationSM Initiative which is working to help 27 million Americans become more physically active by 2027.

The League is looking to support the growing number of grassroot advocates and organizations across the country who are creating local change every day. The League's Bicycle Friendly America program will award Community Spark Grants to 10 organizations, with five of those being organizations in GM home communities. (See the list of eligible GM Cities here.) Eligible organizations are nonprofits and public or government organizations/agencies, and priority will be given to organizations and partners led by or directly serving people from racial and ethnic minority groups. Other types of organizations will be considered on a case-by-case basis and we encourage everyone to apply. Reach out to the League if you have guestions.

Through the Community Spark Grants, we hope to catalyze and fund projects that will strengthen and build Bicycle Friendly Communities and capacity for local changemakers. Our desire is for organizations to propose projects that uplift the community, center around issues faced by people from ethnic or racial minority groups, and build or create inclusive coalitions that can shed new light on current issues. Funds may support a wide range of bicycling-related projects such as, but not limited to, short term pop-up events, campaigns, tactical urbanism demonstrations, signage, educational events or resources, accessibility audits, or street safety improvements. We are especially looking for projects with new perspectives that increase opportunities for healthy and active ways to get around and include authentic engagement with the community.

The deadline to apply for a Community Spark Grant is July 15, 2022, at 11:59pm PT. Awards will be announced in August 2022.

Grant Restrictions

- The League of American Bicyclists' Community Spark Grant will not be able to fund most permit-required infrastructure, such as sidewalks or concrete for road widening.
 - Bike racks or bike fix-it stations would be allowable.
 - Some other things that are allowable are materials for temporary structures or demonstration/quick builds including paint, vertical delineators, bollards, and signage.






