<u>Title of Item:</u>	Uptown Commercial Solid Waste Collection – Current Approach & Recommended Alternative Discussion
Explanation:	On August 15, 2022 at the City Council Workshop, Raftelis presented Uptown Commercial Waste Collection - Current Approach & Alternatives Presentation. This presentation is a recap of the Project Overview of the Commercial Solid Waste in the Uptown District. Additionally, staff will present recommendations on the alternatives for the collection Uptown Commercial Solid Waste.
	Over the last several years, there have been challenges reported to City staff with the collection of commercial solid waste in Uptown as well as the condition of the dumpster locations relating to cleanliness and aesthetics. Commercial collection sites in Uptown vary from the back of buildings, to adjacent sidewalks, to private parking lots and public parking lots. The public parking lots have been the primary source of the collection and aesthetic challenges throughout the District.
	The City and Raftelis have analyzed the existing collection system and compared the current system to other benchmark/university cities in an effort to develop collection alternatives that are consistent with current best practices. The City and Raftelis have previously provided background on the challenges as well as benchmarking information. This presentation will provided additional information as well as recommended alternatives for Council to consider at the workshop. Staff will use feedback received from Council to implement next steps moving forward.
