Recreation Manager, Sophie Duncan, began leading the planning efforts for summer day camps in the winter of 2022 to allow staff time to research all components of this year's program, including specific trainings, marketing efforts, and identifying activities and trips for camp participants.

Registration for all summer camps began on Monday, February 6<sup>th</sup> through the City of Greenville's website and at various recreation facilities during operating hours. Registration will take place until capacity is met for each specific program. Staff are committed to providing services to the Greenville community, with safety and well-being being a top priority.

Recreation and Parks staff also have organized a diverse lineup of program plans for the spring. Program offerings includes: Adult Kickball, Adult Softball, Future Stars Youth Soccer, Various Sports Clinics, Greenie League Youth Baseball, Various Outdoor Exercise Programs, Several Aquatic Programs, Various Arts & Craft Programs, Outdoor Nature Programs, and Special Events.

Recreation and Parks staff have been working with a City of Greenville resident to bring two permanent chess tables to the Town Common. These chess tables will be the first of its kind in Eastern North Carolina and in the heart of our City.

The resident led all fundraising aspects for this special addition at the Town Common and received the funds through private donations. Parks Maintenance employees will install these tables in the upcoming weeks. The location of the tables can be shown in Attachment A. The Park will remain open during the installation.

Studies has shown that chess has been known to improve decision-making, problem-solving, creativity, and more for all age groups. Re:	Green Mill Run Streambank Stabilization Project/Greenway Closure

The Recreation and Parks Department was awarded an Environmental Enhancement Grant to perform a streambank stabilization project on a 75' long section of Green Mill Run. This project will prevent further erosion and sedimentation that is currently occurring along the streambank. The project will also protect the Green Mill Run Greenway which runs parallel to the stream.

After a competitive bid process, the City has awarded the construction contract to Bridgeview Contractors to perform this work. The contractor is planning to start work the week of February 13<sup>th</sup> but could be delayed depending on the weather conditions.

Once started, the work must be completed within 45 calendar days. This project will require a temporary greenway closure between Elm St and 10<sup>th</sup> St. Signs notifying the public of this temporary closure will be posted and announcements will be made online via social media.
