- 1. Contractor is to provide verification to the City that the company's employees are covered under worker's compensation insurance coverage.
- 2. It is expressly understood by the bidders that written notice of award and/or receipt of purchase order will constitute agreement by the City to consummate the transaction and will serve together with the proposal, scope of work, and these instructions as the entire form of contract between the parties except in cases where formal contracts are warranted.
- 3. Each Contractor submitting a bid is affirming that no official or employee of the City is directly or indirectly interested in this bid for any reason of personal gain.
- 4. Sales taxes may be listed on the bid, but as a separate item. No charge will be allowed for Federal Excise and Transportation Tax from which the City is exempt.
- 5. Questions regarding the specifications for submission of the bid for Public Safety Annex Facility Generator/Electrical shall be directed by email to Michael Turner, Building Facilities Coordinator at <a href="mailto:mturner@greenvillenc.gov">mturner@greenvillenc.gov</a>.
- 6. By submitting a bid for the Contractor to provide Public Safety Annex Facility Generator/Electrical, the Contractor attests that it is in compliance with all items listed in the bid/proposal instructions. Further, the Contractor attests that the City of Greenville accepts no responsibility for any injuries to the firm's employees while on City property performing their duties.
- 7. Contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws, as well as safety/regulatory requirements and ordinances associated with the work within this contract.

- 9. The Contractor shall accompany a designated representative(s) of the City on inspections of work at any time during the contract period. The City reserves the right to make determinations as to whether service is performed satisfactorily.
- 10. Deficiencies in work performance must be corrected immediately. The City reserves the right to add or delete similar items/services specified in the bid as requirements change during the period of the contract. Prices for items/services to be added or deleted from contract will be mutually agreed upon by the City of Greenville and the Contractor. A contract amendment will be issued for each addition or deletion.
- 11. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to visit the site that will be covered in this contract and to understand the area that is to be included prior to submitting a bid.

- 12. All work shall be completed in a professional manner consistent with customary industry practices.
- 13. Contractor is responsible for all measurements pertaining to the scope of work when submitting a bid.
- 14. Contractor shall be responsible for damage to the property caused by Public Safety Annex Facility Generator/Electrical work, including, but not limited to, buildings, curbs, parking blocks, islands, sidewalks, light poles, signs, landscaping, paving or striping of the property or equipment used in connection therewith.

- 18. Contractor shall not engage subcontractors to perform the Services without the City of Greenville's prior written consent by the Director of Public Works or designee. If any part of this work agreement is sublet, the subcontractor shall be required to meet all insurance requirements set forth in the Agreement. The parties stipulate that the Company will maintain each type of insurance set forth in the Agreement at a coverage equal to the amount set forth in the Agreement at a coverage equal to the amount set forth for each type of insurance. However, nothing contained herein shall relieve the Company from meeting all insurance requirements or otherwise being responsible for the subcontractor.

- 20. Contractor agrees to provide a two (2) year warranty on all labor and standard manufacturer's warranty on materials.
- 21. Contractor is responsible for protecting work area(s) from damage and will be responsible for repairs from construction and/or damage.
- 22. Contractor shall provide a submittal package for review by Owner.
- 23. Work will be completed between the hours of 7:00 am and 5:00 pm, Monday-Friday. Any work deemed necessary outside of these normal work hours shall be coordinated with City Staff.
- 24. All areas of work shall maintain a safe working zone and cleaned up daily, as well as, completely at the completion of the job.

#### 1.0 SCOPE:

#### Scope of Work:

Provide and install a 100kW generator, enclosure and concrete pad, 600 amp, service-rated ATS, UPS system, 20 & 30 amp receptacle circuits, devices and accessories, low voltage wiring, horizontal wire mold and accessories listed in Materials and Installation below.

#### Materials and Installation:

- 1. Provide and install (1) one, 100kW, 120-208 volt, 3-phase, 4-wire diesel generator with 130 mph rated, level 3 enclosure with a 4" exhaust silencer, remote E-stop, remote annunciator and a minimum 72 hour run time under max load. Generator shall be Cummins brand or approved equal.
- 2. Provide and install labor and materials for a concrete pad per the specifications of the generator manufacturer. See the attached Exhibit "C" for location of generator.
- 3. Provide and install (4) four, (6") six inch, concrete filled, pipe bollards around generator with high density polyethylene covers. Cover color and location(s) to be determined by Owner.
- 4. Provide and install (1) one, 600 amp, service-rated, 208 volt, 3-phase, 3 pole automatic transfer switch (ATS) with Modbus/RS-485 communications and NEMA 3-R enclosure. ATS is to be located next to existing C.T. cabinet and service conductors to be routed through ATS back inside to existing main distribution panel. ATS is to be paired/manufactured with the generator manufacturer.
- 5. Provide and install (1) one, Galaxy VS/APC by Schneider Electric GVSUPS20B4FS uninterruptible power supply with Galaxy VS/Schneider Electric GVSBPSU60G-WP maintenance bypass panel. See attached Exhibits "A" and "B" cut sheets. No substitutions will be allowed. Location(s) to be determined by Owner.
- 6. Provide and install (3) three, 30 amp 208/230-1 service and disconnects for (3) three outdoor heat pump condensing units to be installed by others. Location to be determined by Owner.
- 7. Provide and install Le Grand ALA4800-series horizontal, split wire mold to contain (5) five UPS backed 20 amp receptacles, (5) five 20 amp general use receptacles and Cat 6 cable for (5) work stations at a height to be determined by Owner. Location(s) to be determined by Owner.
- 8. Provide and install data conduit required for relocation/installation of all IT devices.
- 9. Contractor shall provide all test results and close out documentation to Owner.
- 10. Generator and ATS shall have a factory startup and test.

#### **Special Conditions:**

Contractor must comply with OSHA regulations.

Contractor is responsible for all work associated within the scope of work.

#### 2.0 GENERAL:

- 2.1 Public Safety Annex Facility Generator/Electrical shall be completed in a professional manner and shall conform to these specifications.
- 2.2 Failure of the contractor to meet or perform work to these specifications as determined by the Public Works Department shall warrant a written notice to the contractor specifying areas of nonperformance or unacceptable performance. Immediate cancellation of the contract or purchase order may occur if performance is not rectified in a timely manner.
- 2.3 Contractor shall be aware of the impending weather conditions and shall follow all product manufacturer's specifications when using products.

#### 3.0 PAYMENT AND BID:

- 3.1 Payment will be made by the City to the Contractor upon said work being performed satisfactorily per specifications and within thirty (30) days of receipt of an approved invoice. All invoices shall have the purchase order number written on them when submitted for payment.
- 3.2 Bidders will comply with all local, state, and federal laws and ordinances governing said work including the current Occupational Safety and Health regulations.
- 3.3 By submitting a bid, the firm is attesting that they are an Equal Opportunity Employer.
- 3.4 The City of Greenville has adopted an Affirmative Action Program. Firms submitting a bid are attesting that they also have taken affirmative action to insure equality of opportunity in all aspects of employment.
- 3.5 Minority and/or Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) Program

- 4.4 Each certificate of insurance shall bear the provision that the policy cannot be altered or canceled in less than ten (10) days after mailing written notice to the assured of such alteration or cancellation, sent registered mail.

#### **Goals and Good Faith Efforts**

Bidders shall submit MWBE information with their bids on the forms provided. This information will be subject to verification by the City prior to contract award. As of July 1, 2009, contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, service providers, or MWBE members of joint ventures intended to satisfy City MWBE goals shall be certified by the NC Office of Historically Underutilized Businesses (NC HUB) only. Firms qualifying as "WBE" for City's goals must be designated as a "women-owned business" by the HUB Office. Firms qualifying as "MBE" for the City's goals must be certified in one of the other categories (i.e.: Black, Hispanic, Asian American, American Indian, Disabled, or Socially and Economically Disadvantaged).
