- Improve our existing infrastructure: Establish funding within the city budget for construction of new sidewalks, bus shelters, ADA curb cuts, and road striping
- **Embrace Vision Zero:** Revisit street standard designs to encourage slower speeds and safer roads
- **Champion innovative interventions:** Encourage City staff to support quick builds/demonstration projects for safer streets and more efficient transit and facilitate a pathway for community members to suggest projects in their neighborhoods.
- Make Greenville a "destination place" by prioritizing transportation in new development:
 - Remove parking minimums
 - Require additional stub-outs in housing developments
 - Require developments to include connections between greenways, schools, businesses, and other developments
 - Revisit zoning requirements to encourage mixed-use dense development
 - Close sidewalk loopholes
- **Connect Greenville to the greater region:** Provide a resolution of support for passenger rail between Raleigh and Greenville
